THE GAME

- » Delaware is playing its final of eight straight games on the road to open the season; it is also the final road game of the calendar year for the Hens.
- » Thursday is the closest distance game to home the Blue Hens have played so far this season; the Bob Carpenter Center is approximately 119 miles from EagleBank Arena.

THE SERIES

- » Former CAA foes, Delaware leads the all-time series against George Mason, 22-13.
- » The Blue Hens are 10-7 versus the Patriots in Fairfax.
- » In the last matchup, the Hens picked up the 67-51 victory over Mason to open the 2016-17 campaign on November 13, 2016. *Makeda Nicholas* and *Bailey Kargo* each posted 10 points for Delaware in the win.

THE COACHES

- » *Natasha Adair* (South Florida '94) is in her second season at Delaware after being named just the fourth women's basketball coach in the program's illustrious history on May 14, 2017.
- » Adair joined the Blue Hens from Georgetown, where she turned around a four-win Hoya program to a postseason contender in three seasons as head coach.
- » Adair is nearing 100 victories as a head coach and currently sits at 94 during her seven-year tenure.
- » *Nyla Milleson* (Kansas State '85, '89) is in her sixth season at the helm of the Patriots. She is 74-90 all-time at Mason and 364-213 in 19 seasons as a head coach, including stops at Drury and Missouri State.

LAST TIME OUT

The Blue Hens led early, but the shots were falling for Boston University Sunday afternoon as Delaware fell to the Terriers, 72-61, at BU's Case Gym. *Makeda Nicholas* led UD with a season-high 18 points to go along with four rebounds and three blocked shots. *Abby Gonzales* added 16 points, three assists, two steals and two rebounds as the Blue Hens fall to 3-4 on the year. *Justina Mascaro* finished the day with nine points, five rebounds, two assists and two steals. Shooting percentages hurt Delaware in the end as the Hens shot 24-for-71 at a clip of .338 while the Terriers (4-2) collected 26 made baskets on 54 attempts (.481). The Hens committed a season-low eight turnovers while forcing 20 BU turnovers.

LAST TIME VS. GEORGE MASON | NOVEMBER 13, 2016 | BOB CARPENTER CENTER

After trailing by a single point at halftime and surviving a blistering surge by the Patriots to open the second half, the Blue Hens (1-0) pulled together and used a dominating final 13 minutes to post the satisfying 67-51 victory in their 2016-17 season opener. *Nicole Enabosi* collected 15 points and seven rebounds while *Makeda Nicholas* and *Bailey Kargo* chipped in with 10 points each. Delaware had a solid shooting night, hitting 24 of 54 shots (44.4 percent) and converting four of six 3-pointers. The Hens also turned the ball over just seven times the entire game, the team's lowest total since committing five in a 62-50 win over North Dakota State on Nov. 29, 2015.

LAST TIME AT GEORGE MASON | DECEMBER 7, 2015 | EAGLEBANK ARENA

Hannah Jardine posted a career night with 31 points, but it wasn't enough as the Blue Hens fell, 90-83, at George Mason in double overtime. Jardine went 5-of-12 from behind the arc and drained a 3-pointer as time expired in regulation to send the game into overtime at 66-66. The forward added seven rebounds, three steals and two assists in a career-high 48 minutes played. Both the Blue Hens (4-3) and Patriots (4-6) scored just six points in the first overtime, but Mason cruised to an 18-11 advantage in the second overtime off of eight free throws for the win. Erika Brown posted 20 points in the loss while Nicole Enabosi registered 12 points and eight rebounds.

BLUE HENS PILING ON FREQUENT FLYER MILES

Delaware is playing its final of eight straight games on the road to open the season while Thursday's game marks the first bus trip for 2018-19. Since November 8, the Blue Hens have taken 12 flights and have visited seven different airports while logging a total of approximately 9,625 miles round-trip by air and bus. Thursday is the closest distance game to home the Blue Hens have played so far this season as the Bob Carpenter Center is approximately 119 miles from EagleBank Arena.

JASMINE DICKEY COLLECTS THIRD STRAIGHT CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK AWARD

The awards keep coming for *Jasmine Dickey* as the forward earned her third straight Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week honor last Monday. The freshman averaged 10.3 rebounds, 7.0 points and 2.0 steals in 30.0 minutes as the Blue Hens went 2-1 overall. Dickey collected a season-best 18 rebounds in a season-high 36 minutes played against Bradley in Delaware's first game of the FAU Thanksgiving Tournament. She added a season-best three steals in the team's win over Lafayette and was named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 12.5 rebounds and 9.5 points for the Hens.

DITTE HEN HEI DEDC

Delaware's 26 assists at Delaware State on November 20 is good to tie for sixth in program single-game history and is the most for the Hens since posting 27 against Delaware State on December 10, 1992. UD's all-time record is 28 assists versus Drexel (February 8, 1992) and Kent State (November 24, 1989). Most recently, the Hens dished out 24 assists against Boston University on November 19, 2017.

SCORING MACHINE VS. DELAWARE STATE

UD's 85 points at Delaware State (November 20) is the most in regulation for the Blue Hens since an 85-71 victory over the College of Charleston on February 14, 2014.

LEFFT COMES UP BIG AT DELAWARE STATE

The biggest spark of the night against the Hornets may have been provided by Gadson Lefft. The redshirt senior scored her first career points in a Blue Hens uniform and finished the night with 15 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the field and a mark of 3-for-3 from the charity stripe. Lefft added a career-high six rebounds, two assists and two steals in 16 minutes of action. Additionally, nine straight points from the forward in the third turned the tides as Delaware (2-2) took the lead and never looked back in the win.

CAREER GAMES FOR GONZALES

Abby Gonzales has posted back-to-back 20-plus point games for the first time in her career. The guard put up a career-high 20 points against Nicholls State (November 17) before upping her career-best to 21 versus Delaware State (November 20). Entering the season, Gonzales' career-high was 18 against Saint Peters on November 25, 2017.

JASMINE DICKEY EARNS SECOND CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK AWARD

Jasmine Dickey is making a name for herself in her first season in a Delaware uniform as the CAA recognized the forward November 19 as the league's Rookie of the Week for the second straight week. Dickey averaged 13.5 rebounds and 11.5 points as the Blue Hens went 1-1 in the Preseason WNIT. In the team's loss to Montana State, the freshman posted 11 rebounds, eight points and two steals. She added a season-high 16 rebounds and 15 points in the win over Nicholls. Through three games this season, Dickey is averaging 14.7 points and ranks 14th nationally with 13.0 rebounds per contest and has logged two double doubles.

BLUE HENS CRASH THE BOARDS AGAINST NICHOLLS

Delaware registered 50 rebounds against Nicholls on November 17 for the eighth time since 2013. The Blue Hens most recently tallied 50 rebounds on January 26, 2018 against Northeastern

Including Nicholas, 42 women's basketball players haves suited up for at least 100 games at the University of Delaware. *Danielle Parker* (2008-13) holds the program record with 144 career games played.

BLUE HENS ADD AGNES PAUL AND BRYNN WADE FOR 2019-20 CAMPAIGN

Natasha Adair excitedly announced November 16 that Agnes Paul and Brynn Wade have signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Blue Hens beginning in 2019-20. Paul, a 6-2 power forward from Bowie, Md. led New Hope Academy to a 18-13 record and a NACA runner-up finish under head coach Sam Caldwell a year ago. As a junior, Paul led NHA with 240 rebounds and was named to the NACA All-Tournament Team. She is a member of Team Durant AAU squad and also the Nigerian 17U National Team. Wade will join the Blue Hens from Gilbert, Ariz. where she is a 6-1 power forward for head coach Kyle Pedersen at Gilbert High School. She also played at La Cueva High and Hope Christian High in New Mexico and is a member of the New Mexico Heat Elite and Arizona Select AAU teams. "We are more than excited to welcome Agnes and Brynn into the Blue Hens family," Adair commented. "Both are tireless workers and flat out tough players. The future is bright for both Agnes and Brynn and I cannot wait to see them don that Delaware uniform next season."

JASMINE DICKEY MAKES A SPLASH IN DEBUT; NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Blue Hens guard *Jasmine Dickey* made a splash in her Delaware debut on November 9 and was rewarded with her efforts as the Colonial Athletic Association named her the league's Rookie of the Week. Dickey logged 21 points and 12 rebounds in the first round of the Preseason WNIT at Northern lowa and joined rare company with her stat line. The Baltimore, Md. native is the first Delaware freshman since *Nicole Enabosi* (2015) to post a double double in her collegiate debut and scored the most points in a season opener for the Blue Hens since *Elena Delle Donne* collected 33 in 2011. Additionally, Dickey is the first Delaware freshman to post 20-plus points in her collegiate debut since *Anette Percy* registered 21 points in 1994 and is believed to be the first Blue Hen to record 20-plus points and 10-plus rebounds in her first-ever game at Delaware.

DELAWARE KICKS OFF 48TH SEASON OF WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The 2018-19 season marks the 48th overall in the history of the University of Delaware women's basketball program. During their previous 47 years, the Blue Hens have registered a mark of 762-506 (.601) with 31 winning seasons under four head coaches. Last season, Delaware hit 19 wins for the first time since the 2013-14 campaign when UD was 20-11 overall. Entering the year, Delaware averaged 16.2 wins per in the previous 46 seasons. The Hens had also not won more than 10 CAA games since going 18-0 in 2012-13.

CAA PRESEASON RANKINGS/HONORS

Delaware is predicted to finish third in the Colonial Athletic Association Preseason Poll with 61 points while James Madison was predicted to win it all in 2019 with 79 points and seven first place votes. Blue Hens junior *Samone DeFreese* was picked as a Preseason All-CAA Second Team honoree. DeFreese, a starter a season ago and two-time letter winner for Delaware, saw action in all 32 games last year and was ranked 11th in the CAA with 7.4 rebounds per game, 18th with 30.5 minutes played and 19th with 11.3 points per. The forward logged 19 games with double-digit scoring efforts and seven games with double-digit rebounds with six total double doubles.

NICHOLAS IS BACK

Nearly 11 months after seeing the court for the Blue Hens due to injury, *Makeda Nicholas* will return to the floor against Northern Iowa in her final year of eligibility. Nicholas graduated in May from UD with a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology and is currently studying to obtain a Master of Arts degree in education. The forward is currently fifth in the Delaware career record books with 134 blocks, 22nd all-time with 544 rebounds and 47th overall with 634 points and is the team's active career leader with 104 games played.

FRESH FACES

Delaware welcomes three newcomers to the team while graduating three seniors from last season. Freshmen *Lolo Davenport*, *Jasmine Dickey* and *Paris McBride* join the Hens from successful high school campaigns. Following their NLI signings, head coach *Natasha Adair* stated: "I'm really thrilled with this class. My first recruiting class at the University of Delaware has really shaped out to be a big one. We are signing some of the top players in the country, but the most important thing is that they are all character-first people. And that's a big reason why they're here. They fit into what we're doing, they fit the chemistry of our current players and they'll also help take us to the next level."

BLUE HENS WITHOUT CAA PLAYER OF THE YEAR; TOP RECRUIT

The Blue Hens were dealt a blow to the roster during the offseason as *Nicole Enabosi*, the 2018 CAA Player of the Year, and incoming freshman *Lolo Davenport* underwent surgery for ACL injuries. Both will return for Delaware during the 2019-20 campaign.

DELAWARE TO HOST 2019 CAA TOURNAMENT AT BOB CARPENTER CENTER

The CAA Women's Basketball Championship returns to the Bob Carpenter Center for the first time since 2008 with competition being held March 13–16. The tournament was held on campuses prior 2010 before moving to the Show Place Arena in 2011, where it entertained fans for five seasons. James Madison University hosted the tournament in 2017 while Drexel University hosted in 2018.

Natasha Adair was selected as just the fourth women's basketball head coach in the program's illustrious history on May 14, 2017.

In her first season with the Blue Hens, Adair guided Delaware to its most wins (19) and first postseason appearance since the 2013-14 campaign. Additionally, the Hens captured 10 conference victories for the first time since 2012-13.

Under Adair, the Blue Hens were an offensive threat as Delaware averaged its most points (65.8) since 2012-13. Additionally, the Hens logged 80-plus points in six different contests for the first time in six seasons while logging five straight games of 70-plus points to open the year while UD only reached 70-plus points three times in each of the previous two seasons.

Delaware also saw the fifth player in program history pick up Conference Player of the Year accolades as forward Nicole Enabosi earned the Colonial Athletic Association's top individual award while also garnering CAA All-First Team and All-Defensive Team honors for the second straight season. Enabosi finished her junior year by overtaking the Blue Hens single-season records in rebounds (375) and double-doubles (23) while her name is littered among the Delaware single-season Top 10 for points, points per game, rebounds per game, blocked shots, field goals made, field goal percentage, free throws made and free throws attempted.

Adair, who has more than 20 years of coaching experience under her belt, has received the national attention of USA Basketball and currently serves as an assistant coach for the U18 Women's National Basketball Team and has spoken at the USA Basketball Las Vegas Coach Academy. Additionally, Adair served as a U19 Women's World Cup Team Trials Court Coach during the summer of 2017.

Adair joined the Blue Hens from Georgetown University, where she turned around a four-win Hoya program to a postseason contender in three seasons as head coach. Behind Adair's leadership, GU finished 2016-17 with a 17-13 record, the most wins for the Hoyas since 2011-12, and garnered the team's second straight trip to the Postseason WNIT.

The Silver Spring, Md. native is no stranger to the Colonial Athletic Association as her first head coaching stint took her to the College of Charleston, where she was 35-31 overall. In the Cougars' first season in the CAA in 2013-14, Adair guided The College to record of 19-15, marking the third-highest win total in the school's Division I era. Additionally, the squad finished third in conference play, defeated five postseason teams from the previous year and advanced to the semifinals of both the CAA Championship and the Women's Basketball invitational.

Adair played collegiately at Pensacola Junior College (1990-92) before playing and graduating from the University of South Florida with a degree in communications in 1994. She previously spent 13 seasons in the assistant coaching ranks, with seven years (2004-12) at Wake Forest University and six seasons (1998-04) at Georgetown University. Her coaching career has seen her develop and mentor 12 players who went on to play at the professional level.
