THE GAME

» Friday's game is the first Colonial Athletic Association contest of the season for both Delaware and UNCW.

» The Hens are in a stretch in which they're playing nine of 11 games on the road.

» The 2019-20 Delaware athletics season will be a yearlong celebration of the 50th anniversary of women's athletics at the University of Delaware.

THE SERIES

» Delaware leads the all-time series with UNCW, 28-9, since the first meeting in 2001-02.

» UD has won 16 of the last 18 versus the Seahawks.

» The Blue Hens are 10-5 all-time when playing UNCW in Wilmington, N.C.

» The two teams coincidentally finish the regular season series against each other on March 7 at the Bob Carpenter Center.

THE COACHES

» **Natasha Adair** (South Florida '94) is in her third season at UD after being named just the fourth women's basketball coach in the program's illustrious history on May 14, 2017.

» Now in her eighth season overall, Adair recorded her 100th career victory as a head coach during the 2018-19 campaign.

» Adair is heavily involved with USA Basketball and most recently helped guide Team USA U19 squad to a gold medal at the 2019 FIBA Women's World Cup in Thailand as an assistant coach.

» **Karen Barefoot** (Christopher Newport '95) is in her third season as the head coach at UNCW after six successful years at Old Dominion.

LAST TIME OUT

Playing at home for just the second time in six weeks, Delaware gave its fans something to cheer about in the non-conference finale. A strong defensive effort and three players in double figures led the Blue Hens to a dominant 63-44 victory over former CAA foe George Mason on Sunday afternoon at the Bob Carpenter Center. The 44 points is the fewest scored by a Delaware opponent since Saint Joseph's (48-39 win) last year, a span of 29 games. The 24.5-percent from the field is the lowest field-goal percentage for a Blue Hen opponent since Lafayette shot 19-percent. **Nicole Enabosi** poured in her second 20-plus point performance of the year, leading all scorers with 20 points, while grabbing eight rebounds and picking up three steals and two blocks. **Tee Johnson** was outstanding off the bench with 11 points, two rebounds and two steals, while playing great defensively. She led all players with a +24 in the +/- column. **Jasmine Dickey** had her fifth double-double of the year with 11 points and 11 rebounds, while also grabbing four steals and three blocks.

LAST TIME AT UNCW | SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2019 | TRASK COLISEUM

The Blue Hens received career games from **Alison Lewis** and **Rebecca Lawrence**, but Delaware was unable to overcome UNCW in the 72-64 loss at Trask Coliseum. Lewis finished the game with 20 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the field to go along with four free throws. The senior added a team-high seven rebounds and two assists as the Hens fall to 13-13 on the year and 8-6 in CAA play. Lawrence registered 19 points on 9-of-11 shooting and also contributed four rebounds, three assists and two blocked shots. For the game, the Blue Hens shot .500 (26-for-52) and went 8-of-9 (.889) from the charity stripe but in the end shot just nine free throws to UNCW's 29. The loss snapped a three-game winning streak for the Hens.

LAST TIME AT HOME VS. UNCW | FRIDAY, JANUARY 25, 2019 | BOB CARPENTER CENTER

A 26-point performance from **Samone DeFreese** sparked Delaware in its 65-53 victory over UNCW. DeFreese shot 10-of-19 (.526) from the floor while going a perfect 6-for-6 from the charity stripe to record a career day. The forward added a season-best 11 points for her sev-enth career double double – and the first of the season. **Makeda Nicholas** also saw double figures with 11 points while **Alison Lewis** contributed eight points for the Hens (7-11, 2-4 CAA). In a game that saw six lead changes and four tied scores, the two teams held a 28-28 stale-mate at the half. DeFreese changed the story and gave the Blue Hens the lead for good with the second half's first basket just 20 seconds in. The Blue Hens held advantages in rebounds (43-37), blocked shots (5-0) and steals (11-2).

BLUE HENS IN THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Delaware is 215-107 (.668) all-time in CAA regular season play with a 25-17 (.595) mark in the CAA Tournament and two conference titles (2012, 2013). Head coach **Natasha Adair**, who spent one season in the CAA at the College of Charleston is 31-21 against CAA foes.

ENABOSI NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After nearly 500 days away, **Nicole Enabosi** is starting to hit her stride and it couldn't happen at a better time for the Blue Hens. With her 20 points, eight rebounds, three steals and two blocks in Sunday's win over George Mason, Enabosi earned second CAA Player of the Week honor of the season and eighth of her illustrious career. In her seven games this season, Enabosi is averaging 15.3 points and 7.6 rebounds per game, while shooting 51.4-percent from the field.

ENABOSI AND GONZALES REACH CENTURY MARK IN GAMES PLAYED

Nicole Enabosi will become the second Blue Hens player this season to play in her 100th career game for Delaware with Friday's contest at UNCW. The forward is 23rd in Blue Hens history with 3,052 minutes played. A mainstay in the Delaware lineup the past four seasons, **Abby Gonzales** appeared in her 100th career game for the Blue Hens at Robert Morris (December 7). The guard is currently 15th in program history with 3,217 minutes played. The last Hen to reach at least 3,000 minutes played was **Hannah Jardine** from 2013-17 with 3,421 minutes played. **Erika Brown** played in 3,795 minutes during that same time frame.

GONZALES APPROACHING PROGRAM HISTORY

With 315 career assists and 148 career 3-point field goals made, **Abby Gonzales** is slated to become the first-ever Delaware women's basketball player to collect 300-plus assists and 150-plus 3-point field goals made in her career. Her 315 assists are good for fifth in program history while her 148 treys are also good for fifth all-time.

GONZALES HITS ASSISTS MILESTONE

Abby Gonzales became the sixth player in program history to reach 300 career assists with her 10-assist performance against Santa Clara on November 30. The senior guard currently sits with 315 in 103 career games played and is fifth in program history. **Alena Koshansky** (2003-07) is fourth all-time with 346 helpers.

ENABOSI NEARING DOUBLE DOUBLE RECORD

Nicole Enabosi is third all-time with 45 career double doubles. **Colleen McNamara** holds the school record with 47 from 1991-95 while **Elena Delle Donne** posted 46 from 2009-13.

ENABOSI MOVING UP IN CAREER RECORD BOOKS

Nicole Enabosi is 11th in program history with 1,356 career points. **Erika Brown** is 10th all-time with 1,402 points scored from 2013-17.

ENABOSI RETURNS TO BLUE HENS IN DRAMATIC FASHION

Blue Hens forward **Nicole Enabosi** returned to the court after a nearly 16-month hiatus and promptly returned to her old ways as the 2018 Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year was named the CAA Player of the Week on December 2. Enabosi, who missed all of last season and the first four games of this season due to an ACL injury, averaged 22.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 steals while leading Delaware to its first two wins of the year this past weekend. The Gaithersburg, Md. native led the Hens with a career-high 32 points to go along with eight rebounds in the 81-80 overtime victory against Santa Clara. Enabosi opened her year with 13 points in 17 minutes of action in the previous day's win over Cal State Fullerton. For her efforts, Enabosi was named to the Titan Classic All-Tournament Team.

GONZALES DROPS DOUBLE-DIGIT DIMES

With 10 assists in the Nov. 30 win over Santa Clara, **Abby Gonzales** became just the third-ever Blue Hen to record at least 10 assists in a single game multiple times in her career. She previously dished out 10 assists versus Boston University on November 19, 2017. **Sue Whitfield** (1984-88) and **Bridget McCarthy** (1987-91) each posted three 10-plus assist games during their four-year careers.

DELAWARE PICKS UP OVERTIME VICTORY AGAINST SANTA CLARA

UD's 81-80 win against Santa Clara was the first for the Blue Hens in overtime since a 56-55 decision at American on November 16, 2016. Delaware previously had lost four straight overtime and double overtime decisions since that 2016 contest.

BLUE HENS ADD TARA COUSINS AND TYI SKINNER FOR 2020-21 CAMPAIGN

Delaware women's basketball head coach **Natasha Adair** excitedly announced that **Tara Cousins** and **Tyi Skinner** have signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Blue Hens beginning in 2020-21. "We're excited to welcome both Tara and Tyi into the Blue Hens family. There aren't enough attributes to discuss the positives that both will bring with them. Kudos to our current players for building the current culture of our program and I know that Tara and Tyi will really complement what we're doing. I cannot wait to see them in blue and gold, and just to see their impact felt as soon as they get here." Cousins, a 5-8 guard from Washington, D.C., averaged 22.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 7.0 assists per game as a junior last season at Woodrow Wilson High School. The 2019 DCIAA Player of the Year, Cousins transferred to New Hope Academy for her senior campaign. NHA is ranked as the top girl's high school program in the country by USA Today and also produced current Delaware freshman Agnes Paul. A 5-5 guard from Washington, D.C., Skinner transferred to TPLS Christian Academy midway through her junior season where she averaged 25 points per game, 8.0 assists, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 steals per game.

DELAWARE KICKS OFF 49TH SEASON OF WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The 2019-20 season marks the 49th overall in the history of the University of Delaware women's basketball program. During their previous 48 years, the Blue Hens have registered a mark of 778-521 (.599) with 32 winning seasons under four head coaches.

UD SLATED TO FINISH FOURTH IN CAA; DEFRESE AND ENABOSI EARN PRESEASON HONORS

The Blue Hens were predicted to finish fourth in the CAA Preseason Poll. Additionally, **Nicole Enabosi** and **Samone DeFreese** were picked as Preseason All-CAA honorees. Under third-year head coach **Natasha Adair**, the Blue Hens look to improve upon a 16-15 record from a season ago. UD returns four starters and seven letter winners from last season in addition to seeing Enabosi back on the court following ACL surgery that kept her out last year. The 2018 CAA Player of the Year, Enabosi earned Preseason First Team accolades. She finished her junior campaign ranked in the Top 10 of nine Delaware single-season categories while leading the CAA in points per game (18.0), rebounds per game (11.8) and defensive rebounds per game (8.9). A starter for the past two seasons, DeFreese was tabbed a Preseason Second Team selection. A CAA All-Second Team honoree last season, the forward the Blue Hens with 10.9 points per game and a 73.3 (77-for-105) free throw percentage.

The trio led the 2018 USA Women's U18 National Team to a gold medal, earning the team a berth in the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup.

Natasha Adair was selected as just the fourth women's basketball head coach in the program's illustrious history on May 14, 2017.

In her first season with the Blue Hens, Adair guided Delaware to its most wins (19) and first postseason appearance since the 2013-14 campaign. Additionally, the Hens captured 10 conference victories for the first time since 2012-13.

Under Adair, the Blue Hens were an offensive threat as Delaware averaged its most points (65.8) since 2012-13. Additionally, the Hens logged 80-plus points in six different contests for the first time in six seasons while logging five straight games of 70-plus points to open the year while UD only reached 70-plus points three times in each of the previous two seasons.

Delaware also saw the fifth player in program history pick up Conference Player of the Year accolades as forward Nicole Enabosi earned the Colonial Athletic Association's top individual award while also garnering CAA All-First Team and All-Defensive Team honors for the second straight season. Enabosi finished her junior year by overtaking the Blue Hens single-season records in rebounds (375) and double-doubles (23) while her name is littered among the Delaware single-season Top 10 for points, points per game, rebounds per game, blocked shots, field goals made, field goal percentage, free throws made and free throws attempted.

Adair, who has more than 20 years of coaching experience under her belt, has received the national attention of USA Basketball and has served as an assistant coach for the U19 and U18 Women's National Basketball Teams and has spoken at the USA Basketball Las Vegas Coach Academy. Additionally, Adair served as a U19 Women's World Cup Team Trials Court Coach during the summer of 2017.

Adair joined the Blue Hens from Georgetown University, where she turned around a four-win Hoya program to a postseason contender in three seasons as head coach. Behind Adair's leadership, GU finished 2016-17 with a 17-13 record, the most wins for the Hoyas since 2011-12, and garnered the team's second straight trip to the Postseason WNIT.

The Silver Spring, Md. native is no stranger to the Colonial Athletic Association as her first head coaching stint took her to the College of Charleston, where she was 35-31 overall. In the Cougars' first season in the CAA in 2013-14, Adair guided The College to record of 19-15, marking the third-highest win total in the school's Division I era. Additionally, the squad finished third in conference play, defeated five postseason teams from the previous year and advanced to the semifinals of both the CAA Championship and the Women's Basketball invitational.

Adair played collegiately at Pensacola Junior College (1990-92) before playing and graduating from the University of South Florida with a degree in communications in 1994. She previously spent 13 seasons in the assistant coaching ranks, with seven years (2004-12) at Wake Forest University and six seasons (1998-04) at Georgetown University. Her coaching career has seen her develop and mentor 12 players who went on to play at the professional level.
