DRAGONS

THE GAME

- » The Blue Hens are playing their first of three straight on the road.
- » **Nicole Enabosi** continues to climb up the Delaware career record books and is currently ninth all-time in points (1,423) and seventh in rebounds (887).
- » The 2019-20 Delaware athletics season will be a yearlong celebration of the 50th anniversary of women's athletics at the University of Delaware.

THE SERIES

- » The longest rivalry in program history, Delaware leads Drexel in the all-time series, 49-35.
- » The Dragons have won nine straight and 11 of the last 12 against the Blue Hens.
- » UD is 21-17 all-time against Drexel in Philadelphia.
- » In the last matchup in Philadelphia, Drexel topped Delaware, 58-41, on February 10, 2019.
- » The last time the Hens defeated the Dragons came with a 55-48 upset in the CAA Tournament on March 13, 2015.
- » The Blue Hens last picked up a win at the DAC on Feb. 18, 2014 with a 55-50 victory over the Dragons.
- » The two teams complete the regular season series in Newark on February 16, 2020.

THE COACHES

- » **Natasha Adair** (South Florida '94) is in her third season at UD after being named just the fourth women's basketball coach in the program's illustrious history on May 14, 2017.
- » Now in her eighth season overall, Adair recorded her 100th career victory as a head coach during the 2018-19 campaign.
- » Adair is heavily involved with USA Basketball and most recently helped guide Team USA U19 squad to a gold medal at the 2019 FIBA Women's World Cup in Thailand as an assistant coach.
- » **Denise Dillon** (Villanova '96) is in her 17th season as the head coach at Drexel and has led the Dragons to a 316-210 record during her tenure.
- » Dillon is 19-18 lifetime against Delaware.

LAST TIME OUT

Third quarter woes hindered the Blue Hens last Sunday afternoon as Delaware fell to Northeastern, 72-62, at the Bob Carpenter Center. The two teams finished the first and second quarters with the same amount of points before the Huskies outscored the Hens, 21-12, in the third. NU added a one-point advantage in the fourth quarter en route to victory. **Jasmine Dickey** posted double doubles in back-to-back games for Delaware and finished the contest with a team-best 17 points and 10 rebounds to go along with three steals and two assists. **Samone DeFreese** (13) and **Nicole Enabosi** (11) also recorded double figure scoring efforts with each collecting four rebounds and three assists for the Hens.

LAST TIME AT DREXEL | SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 10, 2019 | DASKALAKIS ATHLETIC CENTER

Delaware snapped a four-game winning streak Sunday evening as the Blue Hens fell to Drexel, 58-41, at the Daskalakis Athletic Center. **Makeda Nicholas** guided the Hens (10-12, 5-5 CAA) with 13 points, seven rebounds and two assists while **Rebecca Lawrence** tallied eight points and three rebounds and **Lizzie Oleary** collected six points and eight rebounds. Delaware led off with the first points of the game, but Drexel quickly went up by 10 and never looked back. The Hens outrebounded the Dragons, 30-28, and also tied a season-low with 13 fouls. Delaware was without rookie standout **Jasmine Dickey**, who broke her hand earlier in the week.

LAST TIME VS. DREXEL AT HOME | SUNDAY, JANUARY 13, 2019 | BOB CARPENTER CENTER

The offensive woes continued for the Blue Hens as they fell to long-time rival Drexel, 57-40. On the defensive end, **Makeda Nicholas** logged a game-high 11 rebounds to go along with five points, two blocks, an assist and a steal for the Hens (5-10, 0-3 CAA). **Bailey Kargo** led Delaware with 12 points and three rebounds while Alison Lewis added nine points for the Hens. **Samone DeFreese** and **Jasmine Dickey** each put up five points with eight and seven rebounds, respectively. Delaware, which averaged 61.0 points per in 11 non-conference games, logged 44.8 points per in its prior four games, including three against conference opponents.

ENABOSI AND GONZALES REACH CENTURY MARK IN GAMES PLAYED

Delaware has seen two Blue Hens appear in their 100th career games this season as **Abby Gonzales** reached the century mark on December 7 at Robert Morris while **Nicole Enabosi** saw the milestone on January 3 at UNCW. Gonzales is currently 14th in program history with 3,342 minutes played (107 games) while Enabosi is 15th with 3,183 minutes played (103 games). The last Hens to reach at least 3,000 minutes played were **Erika Brown** (3,795; 124 games) and **Hannah Jardine** (3,421; 122 games) from 2013-17.

ENABOSI NEARING DOUBLE DOUBLE RECORD

Nicole Enabosi is third all-time with 45 career double doubles. **Colleen McNamara** holds the school record with 47 from 1991-95 while **Elena Delle Donne** posted 46 from 2009-13.

ENABOSI NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After nearly 500 days away, **Nicole Enabosi** is starting to hit her stride and it couldn't happen at a better time for the Blue Hens. With her 20 points, eight rebounds, three steals and two blocks in December 29's win over George Mason, Enabosi earned second CAA Player of the Week honor of the season and eighth of her illustrious career. In her seven games this season, Enabosi is averaging 15.3 points and 7.6 rebounds per game, while shooting 51.4-percent from the field.

GONZALES HITS ASSISTS MILESTONE

Abby Gonzales became the sixth player in program history to reach 300 career assists with her 10-assist performance against Santa Clara on November 30. The senior guard currently sits with 331 in 107 career games played and is fifth in program history. **Alena Koshansky** (2003-07) is fourth all-time with 346 helpers.

ENABOSI RETURNS TO BLUE HENS IN DRAMATIC FASHION

Blue Hens forward **Nicole Enabosi** returned to the court after a nearly 16-month hiatus and promptly returned to her old ways as the 2018 Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year was named the CAA Player of the Week on December 2. Enabosi, who missed all of last season and the first four games of this season due to an ACL injury, averaged 22.5 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.0 steals while leading Delaware to its first two wins of the year in late November. The Gaithersburg, Md. native led the Hens with a career-high 32 points to go along with eight rebounds in the 81-80 overtime victory against Santa Clara. Enabosi opened her year with 13 points in 17 minutes of action in the previous day's win over Cal State Fullerton. For her efforts, Enabosi was named to the Titan Classic All-Tournament Team.

GONZALES DROPS DOUBLE-DIGIT DIMES

With 10 assists in the Nov. 30 win over Santa Clara, **Abby Gonzales** became just the third-ever Blue Hen to record at least 10 assists in a single game multiple times in her career. She previously dished out 10 assists versus Boston University on November 19, 2017. **Sue Whitfield** (1984-88) and **Bridget McCarthy** (1987-91) each posted three 10-plus assist games during their four-year careers.

BLUE HENS ADD TARA COUSINS AND TYI SKINNER FOR 2020-21 CAMPAIGN

Delaware women's basketball head coach **Natasha Adair** excitedly announced that **Tara Cousins** and **Tyi Skinner** have signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Blue Hens beginning in 2020-21. "We're excited to welcome both Tara and Tyi into the Blue Hens family. There aren't enough attributes to discuss the positives that both will bring with them. Kudos to our current players for building the current culture of our program and I know that Tara and Tyi will really complement what we're doing. I cannot wait to see them in blue and gold, and just to see their impact felt as soon as they get here." Cousins, a 5-8 guard from Washington, D.C., averaged 22.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 7.0 assists per game as a junior last season at Woodrow Wilson High School. The 2019 DCIAA Player of the Year, Cousins transferred to New Hope Academy for her senior campaign. NHA is ranked as the top girl's high school program in the country by USA Today and also produced current Delaware freshman Agnes Paul. A 5-5 guard from Washington, D.C., Skinner transferred to TPLS Christian Academy midway through her junior season where she averaged 25 points per game, 8.0 assists, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 steals per game.

UD SLATED TO FINISH FOURTH IN CAA; DEFREESE AND ENABOSI EARN PRESEASON HONORS

The Blue Hens were predicted to finish fourth in the CAA Preseason Poll. Additionally, **Nicole**

Enabosi and **Samone DeFreese** were picked as Preseason All-CAA honorees. UD returns four starters and seven letter winners from last season in addition to seeing Enabosi back on the court following ACL surgery that kept her out last year. The 2018 CAA Player of the Year, Enabosi earned Preseason First Team accolades. She finished her junior campaign ranked in the Top 10 of nine Delaware single-season categories while leading the CAA in points per game (18.0), rebounds per game (11.8) and defensive rebounds per game (8.9). A starter for the past two seasons, DeFreese was tabbed a Preseason Second Team selection. A CAA All-Second Team honoree last season, the forward the Blue Hens with 10.9 points per game and a 73.3 (77-for-105) free throw percentage.

Natasha Adair was selected as just the fourth women's basketball head coach in the program's illustrious history on May 14, 2017.

In her first season with the Blue Hens, Adair guided Delaware to its most wins (19) and first postseason appearance since the 2013-14 campaign. Additionally, the Hens captured 10 conference victories for the first time since 2012-13.

Under Adair, the Blue Hens were an offensive threat as Delaware averaged its most points (65.8) since 2012-13. Additionally, the Hens logged 80-plus points in six different contests for the first time in six seasons while logging five straight games of 70-plus points to open the year while UD only reached 70-plus points three times in each of the previous two seasons.

Delaware also saw the fifth player in program history pick up Conference Player of the Year accolades as forward Nicole Enabosi earned the Colonial Athletic Association's top individual award while also garnering CAA All-First Team and All-Defensive Team honors for the second straight season. Enabosi finished her junior year by overtaking the Blue Hens single-season records in rebounds (375) and double-doubles (23) while her name is littered among the Delaware single-season Top 10 for points, points per game, rebounds per game, blocked shots, field goals made, field goal percentage, free throws made and free throws attempted.

Adair, who has more than 20 years of coaching experience under her belt, has received the national attention of USA Basketball and has served as an assistant coach for the U19 and U18 Women's National Basketball Teams and has spoken at the USA Basketball Las Vegas Coach Academy. Additionally, Adair served as a U19 Women's World Cup Team Trials Court Coach during the summer of 2017.

Adair joined the Blue Hens from Georgetown University, where she turned around a four-win Hoya program to a postseason contender in three seasons as head coach. Behind Adair's leadership, GU finished 2016-17 with a 17-13 record, the most wins for the Hoyas since 2011-12, and garnered the team's second straight trip to the Postseason WNIT.

The Silver Spring, Md. native is no stranger to the Colonial Athletic Association as her first head coaching stint took her to the College of Charleston, where she was 35-31 overall. In the Cougars' first season in the CAA in 2013-14, Adair guided The College to record of 19-15, marking the third-highest win total in the school's Division I era. Additionally, the squad finished third in conference play, defeated five postseason teams from the previous year and advanced to the semifinals of both the CAA Championship and the Women's Basketball invitational.

Adair played collegiately at Pensacola Junior College (1990-92) before playing and graduating from the University of South Florida with a degree in communications in 1994. She previously spent 13 seasons in the assistant coaching ranks, with seven years (2004-12) at Wake Forest University and six seasons (1998-04) at Georgetown University. Her coaching career has seen her develop and mentor 12 players who went on to play at the professional level.
